

# Raje inaugurates high-tech police control room in Jaipur

**JAIPUR** : Chief minister Vasundhara Raje inaugurated a state-of-the-art control room at the police commissionerate on Thursday.

The new control room bolsters the existing surveillance infrastructure of the city with special emphasis on monitoring the various areas of the Walled City. The control room, which has been named ABHAY, consists of a video wall which shows CCTV footage from various areas of the city. According to the police, the CCTV data from the control room will be saved for a period of one month for investigation purposes. The control room is also equipped with a number of software such as facial recognition system and GPS tracking of PCR vans.

The control room was inaugurated in the presence of chief minister Vasundhara Raje, home minister Gulab Chand Kataria, director general of police Manoj Bhatt, commissioner of police Sanjay Agarwal and other high ranking officials.

According to the police, the control room will also be connected with all mobile units and

will be in constant touch with police stations coming under the Jaipur commissionerate.

The control room has 16 receivers on which emergency calls will be received 24 X 7.

The police said that all the personnel who will be operating the control room have also been given special training to deal with contingencies and emergency situations.

The ABHAY control room also has the facility to track a caller

through GPS following which help will reach him in a very short time.

"Every citizen will benefit from this initiative because it will provide safety and security to the entire city. We are planning to open more such control rooms in all the divisional headquarters and then the districts will also be included," said the chief minister.

At present, 464 cameras are working as part of this system in different parts of the city.
